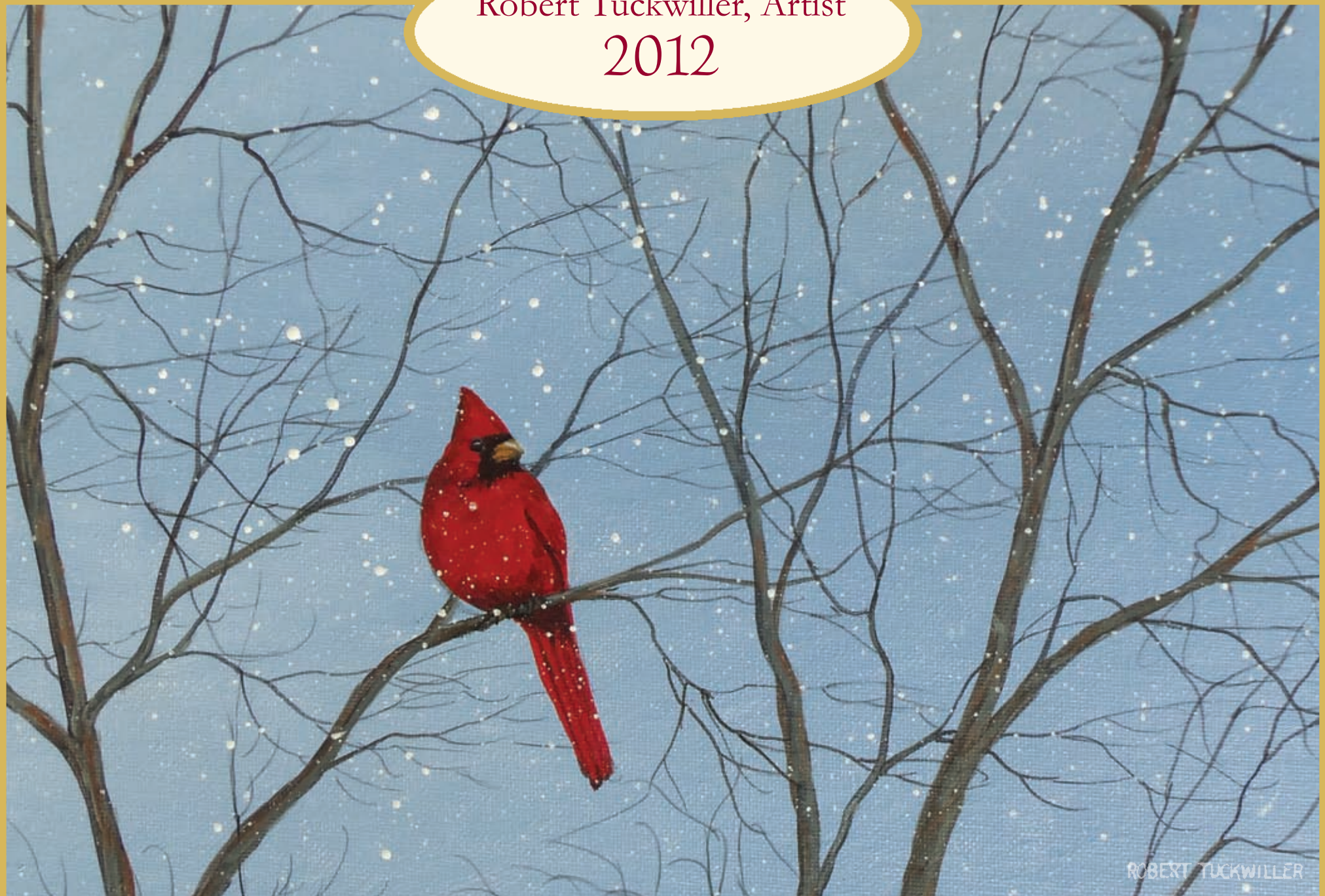

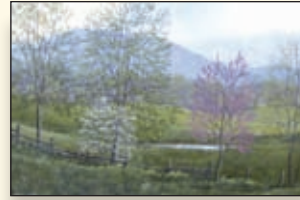

About the Artist

Robert E. Tuckwiller (1953 -) - is one of today's most prolific and successful Artists. Born and raised in Greenbrier County, West Virginia, his parents enrolled him in his first formal art class when he was 9 years old. He continued to develop his artistic talents throughout his formative years and, in 1976 he obtained a B. S. degree in art from Concord University. Acclaimed as a realist, Tuckwiller's artwork depicts the quiet beauty of the pastoral countryside and the natural environment. For over 30 years, Tuckwiller has painted and sold several thousand original paintings, and he has released more than 112 signed and numbered limited edition prints, 64 of which are sold out and available only on the secondary market. Tuckwiller's award-winning artwork can be found in more than 26,000 private and corporate collections throughout the U.S. and abroad. His art is the perfect gift for any occasion.

The **Tuckwiller Art Gallery** is located in Robert's hometown of Lewisburg, West Virginia, recognized as one of the best small art towns in America, one of the 1000 places to see in the U.S. and Canada before you die, one of the best small town escapes, and last year was voted the coolest small town in America. The Gallery is in the heart of downtown at 102 West Washington Street, across the from the City's new fountain park. The Gallery, which is open Tuesday through Saturday, attracts visitors from around the world. The **Tuckwiller Art Studio** is located in Robert's home, in Newport, Virginia, 8 miles west of Blacksburg, Virginia. It is open by appointment only. His home, a Gulf Coast cottage design, is unique for southwest Virginia. His website can be found at www.tuckwillergallery.com.

Some of his achievements include the following: Concord University Outstanding Alumni Award – 2005; Virginia General Assembly Honoree – 1996; QVC Quest for America's Best Tour – one of 20 Virginia businesses and the only artist selected in promotional tour – 1995; and Greenbrier East High School Hall of Fame Inductee – 1991.

Robert enjoys hiking, biking, fishing, and canoeing, all of which help him find subjects to paint. He also enjoys writing, and in 1996 wrote the script for *Riders of the Flood*, an outdoor drama about the Greenbrier River Valley region in the late 1880's based on a book of the same title. It premiered at the Island Park Amphitheater in Ronceverte, West Virginia in 2002, and celebrated its eighth season in 2011. In 2006 he completed the writing of a second outdoor drama, *Big Dreams – Restless Spirit*. It premiered in 2007 and was performed again in 2011.
